Danielle Jatlow, LICSW LADC is the Director of Community Health Initiatives/SAMH Services at Centerpoint. Danielle provides clinical and operational leadership to Centerpoint's integrated treatment and support for youth, young adults, parents, and families impacted by a broad range of social, emotional, mental health and substance abuse issues. She also plays a key leadership role in Centerpoint's community partnerships and program development, including school-based and host-site SAMH programs.

Danielle is Adjunct Faculty in the University of Vermont's Department of Social Work and is a Principal in Centerpoint's Consultation, Training, and Technical Assistance Services.

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Prior to settling in Vermont, Danielle worked with homeless youth in San Francisco and was a Coro Community Fellow with a focus on ethical, effective public sector leadership. Danielle's work at The Family Center in New York City included working with youth and families impacted by HIV and other medical health issues. At Family Justice (Vera Institute of Justice), she developed a family-to-family mentoring program for incarcerated adults returning to their community.
